



Wisemen Still Seek Him Randy Covington, Executive Director

One of the timeless Christmas carols of the season of Christ's birth is "We Three Kings of Orient Are." It has been sung each year for more than a century. While there are many miracles and mysteries surrounding the Nativity, the visit to Bethlehem by these men from the East is shrouded in mystery. Were there three of them? Were they kings, wisemen or magi? What is a magi? Where did they come from? How did they know about the impending birth of Christ? How do you follow a star? When did they find the Christ child?

Christian folklore has attempted to answer some of these questions. Suggested names have been given to three of them: Caspar - a young man from the continent of Europe; Melchior - an older man with a white beard from the Asian continent; and Balthazar, a middle-aged man of African descent. Attempts have been made by some to explain the symbolic meaning of the gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh and their intrinsic value to this pivotal event in history. However, most of the questions surrounding these men remain a mystery to us today.

What can we learn from the actions and attitudes of these characters who have been memorialized in most artistic nativity scenes that we see today? I once heard the statement that "wisemen still seek him." I have contemplated that thought many times to understand what it takes to be a wise man. Here are some things that I have learned from the passage we find in Matthew 2:1-16.

- 1. Wise men seek diligently to know Christ! These were learned men. Whether they were kings, wisemen, or priestsages, it appears evident that they spent a lot of time studying manuscripts and written sources of knowledge of their day. They most likely studied astrology and the natural sciences and appeared to be familiar with Jewish prophecy. It is ironic that they seemed to know more about the prophecy of the birth of a Messiah than the king of the lews.
- 2. Wise men seek the abundant joy of knowing Christ! There was great expectation for what they would find. Verse 10 tells us that when they found the place where the child was, they were full of joy. The fact that their investigation of this promised birth compelled them to travel such a great distance is evidence of an urgency to observe this historic event in person. The valuable gifts they brought to honor this new king demonstrates hope for a momentous life and reign.
- 3. Wise men seek to worship the Christ of the ages! These men's response to an unknown king is, perhaps, the most intriguing aspect of the story. What more did they know to cause them to bow down and worship this young child? (v 11) What could they possibly know about his future impact on the history of mankind? This one truth I know: When wise men seek diligently to know Christ and the joy that can be found in that knowledge, the only response is to worship Him!

That's what Christmas is about for those who have encountered the Christ child in a personal way. We know Him intimately! We know the joy of his transforming grace in our lives! We have the privilege of worshipping him and gifting our lives in service to Him. My prayer for you during this blessed season is that you will encounter Him in a fresh way and celebrate the greatest miracle ever brought forth on the earth. Worship Him, for He alone is worthy.

One of the greatest privileges in my ministry has been to work with a strong structure of missions and cooperation through leadership at the local church, association, state, national and international entities. This is the structure of the Southern Baptist Convention. It is my opinion that when Jesus said, "whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things" that networks like associations and state conventions that exist to support the local church are "greater things." We cooperate with one another because of the mission even though we may have differences and uniqueness in each church. I have seen Alaska Baptist do great things in my 23 years of working in our state.

My hope for our convention is that you will continue to build upon this strong foundation and work in the future to do greater things with churches, associations and other partners working to reach and disciple the residents of Alaska. Here is a statement you may have heard people say, "we do things better together." Jesus never intended for Christians to be in isolation. It is better to be involved with and relate to the body of believers. I am not an independent Baptist because I believe in this principle of working and doing missions with other believers and churches. Here are a few opportunities I want you to be aware of are the result of churches working together to do something bigger and better to support local churches in their ministry. The youth leaders in the Anchorage area have had a great history of meeting and doing things together. In Anchorage, January 4, there will be a Youth Worker's Training event. This is for all youth leaders and their helpers. The location and leadership team is TBD so look for upcoming information on our website and through the Info Blast. This same training is to be held in the Fairbanks area January 11. On January 20, the Anchorage Youth Leader Network will host a "Dodge Ball" competition at East High School. Each team will compete for prizes and enjoy the fun of being with young people around the area. It is an opportunity to bring unchurched youth to an event where they will hear the Gospel. Later this spring we are hoping for more activities for our youth and the workers. The leaders meet once a month for fellowship and do a little planning. Have your youth leader contact me for information.

At the beginning of every year the Alaska Baptist Resource Network has offered an evangelism conference that has been an emphasis on preaching, teaching, worship and training. February 10-11 will be our State Evangelism Conference. It will be held at First Baptist Church, Anchorage. This year, we will start the conference with a pre-event training on D-Life Disciple training for churches. Dr. Bill Wilks will lead the training and then preach at our conference. He is the author of D-Life. He pastors NorthPark Baptist in Trussville, Alabama, and has started a nationwide discipleship movement that is now in several states using this strategy. I want to invite you to join us from noon till 4 pm for this training and introduction to D-Life. Our State Evangelism conference will start that evening. We will go through Tuesday evening. Our guests include worship with Clay Scott and others on his team. Clay is a worship leader at Liberty Baptist in the Birmingham area. Ric Camp is the Associational Mission Strategist for the Shelby Association in Alabama and will be one of the presenters. Jarmin Leatherwood is pastor of House and Hope of Restoration in Huntsville and will join us. Finally, Tim Dowdy, VP of Evangelism for NAMB will be our guest, as well. He was pastor of the great church in Eagles Landing, Georgia, before going to NAMB. I believe this conference will be very exciting and I hope you will join us and bring a group from your church. Look on our website for more information and for info on special rates for hotels.

On February 1, the leaders of men's group here in Anchorage will be doling a BOLD conference for men. Brothers on the Line of Defense is a conference to challenge men to live daily for Christ and seek to evangelize others. Look for more information and the list of speakers through the Info Blast and our webpage. Hope to see many of you in the days ahead and enjoy the holidays.

A note from the Alaska Baptist Foundation by Adam Long

Christmas is a celebration of the "Ultimate Gift" of God to humanity – Jesus Christ. Through His death Jesus assumed the penalty of sin and by His resurrection, overcame its consequence of death. In the acceptance of this Ultimate Gift lies the assurance of a restored relationship with God and the benefit of eternal life with Him.

The single greatest thing we can give others is our testimony of what the Ultimate Gift means to us and the benefits of accepting the gift. So often we become ensnared with the worldly trappings of Christmas. Because we are human, we tend to perceive everything from a temporal mindset which drives the desire for immediate gratification and personal enrichment. Worldly ideology is masterful at exploiting this self-focused aspect of human nature. Using the mythological concept of Santa Claus as a marketing technique in furtherance of this concept.

Giving and receiving material gifts is not wrong, but we cannot lose sight of the real value of the Christmas season. The true and permanent gift of Christmas is Jesus Christ. While not everyone is receptive to the gift of salvation, the gift has no restrictions based on physical distinctions. Rather, it is available to every variety of race, ethnicity, or culture of humanity (Revelation 7:9).

Obedient Christians provide testimony to the gift for which they possess as they live out their lives in service to God. The true gift of Christmas is understanding that the unifying love, joy, and hope of salvation finds its beginnings in the birth of Christ but not its ends. Jesus was God's means of distributing salvation for humanity throughout time.

Receiving gifts is usually associated with the celebration of one's birth. However, Jesus' birth is unique in the sense we are the ones receiving the gift, as He is the gift. God through His infinite grace and mercy has allowed us the privilege of both receiving and giving. First, we need to be sure we accept God the Father's gift of Jesus Christ.

Second, we demonstrate the good works prepared for us (Ephesians 2:10) by exhibiting the Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23). While not exhaustive, listed below are ways Christians display the fruit of the spirit in their lives. They involve service and financial support of ministries such as:

Obituary of Marianne Colvert Rollins

Marianne Colvert Rollins of Stafford, Virginia went home to be with her Lord and Savior on November 6, 2024. Born in Little Rock, Arkansas, in 1932, she graduated from Little Rock Central High in 1950 and was a member of Second Baptist Church. She was preceded in death by her beloved husband of 45 years, Donald J. Rollins, as well as her parents, Osie and Elizabeth Colvert, and her only brother, Jim Colvert.

Working in Vacation Bible Schools in Jackson and in the Delta of Mississippi in 1953, she graduated with a B.S. in Education from Blue Mountain College in 1954. Employed by the Anchorage School District of Alaska, she taught first grade and there met her husband, Don, at Calvary Baptist Church. They returned to Mississippi where she taught at Raymond and Van Winkle, Mississippi. In 1958, she and Don taught in a two teacher school in Ruby, Alaska, and then moved to Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky, where Marianne taught in the pre-school division while Don completed his Master's Degree in Theology. Appointed by the North American Mission Board in 1961, they moved to Ft. Yukon, Alaska, and served in villages there and in the King Salmon area until Don was appointed as director of the Alaska Baptist Native School of Theology in Anchorage. Marianne was his ministry assistant in the school and churches where Don pastored.

Marianne maintained a home in Alaska in places stretching from the top of the Aleutian Chain to areas within the Arctic Circle, raising three children as her husband traveled often to other villages. Upon their retirement in 1993, they moved to Shalimar, Florida, where Marianne continued to live for two years after her husband's passing. Moving to Chez Elan Apts., she continued to be active at First Baptist Church, FWB, where she and her husband had been members since 1993. She worked in the Special Education Dept as well as the Grief Share Group and Current Missions there. In 2009, she moved to Fredericksburg and then Stafford, Virginia, to be close to her daughter, son-in-law, and grandchildren, who made her life rich and full. Marianne suffered from aggressive dementia in her final years and still maintained the sweet disposition she held her entire life.

She is survived in death by her three beloved children: Stephen Rollins and his wife Donna, of Homer, Alaska; Donna Simmons and her husband, Bryan of Stafford, Virginia; Bryan J. Rollins of Yamba, New South Wales, Australia; as well as her four precious grandchildren: Jonathon, Braden and his wife Hannah, Benjamin, and Bekah Simmons; her greatgrandchild Flynn; her cousin Rebecca Harrison; her sister-in-law, Ann Colvert; her niece and nephew Jann Stilley and Scott Colvert; her brothers and sisters in law: Frank Ellis, and Cy and Diane Rollins.
