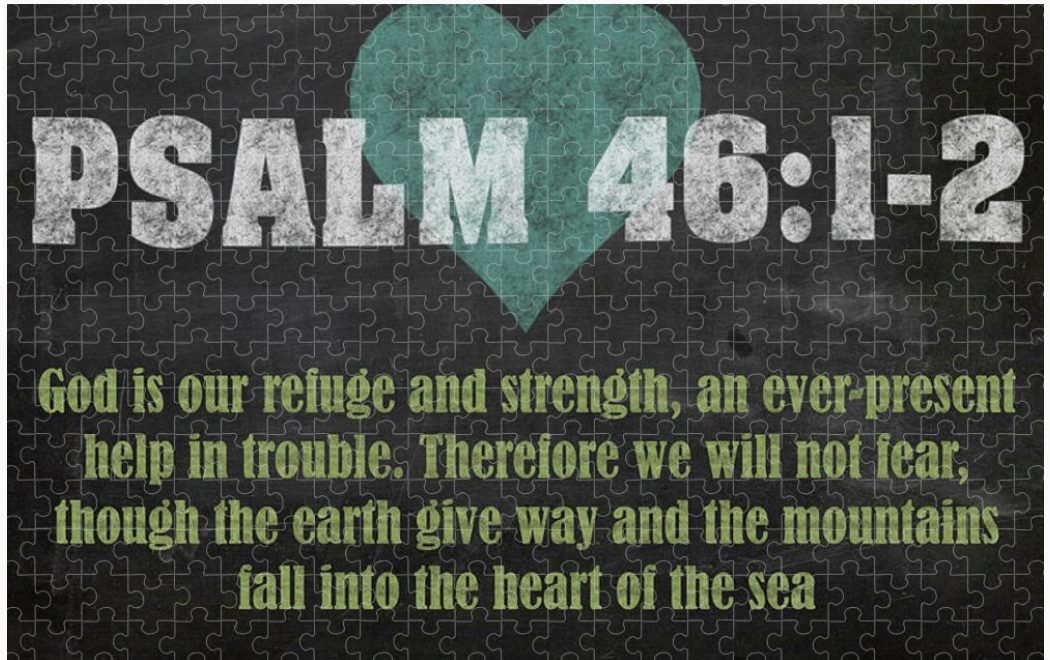

Randy Covington, Executive Director Reflections of an Alaskan Baptist

As I enter the 50th year of ministry and upcoming retirement, I am in a season of reflection on the years I have lived in Alaska and the Alaskan churches that have impacted me in my faith journey. One thing I have discovered since I returned from the mission field is that few of us remember the early days. The generation that established the Alaska Baptist Convention has passed on, and my generation, which inherited the legacy of Alaska Baptists, is quickly moving into its twilight years. I want to share a series of reflections on the six churches I have been a member of, all of which are still in existence today to the glory of God.

First Baptist Church, Anchorage

You could say I was a member of First Baptist Anchorage before I was born. My parents had come to Alaska as newlyweds and had joined First Baptist. My name went on the church roll as an infant in the nursery. My earliest memories of childhood centered around church events. I went to Sunday School, sang in the children's choir, and attended RAs (Royal Ambassadors), where I learned about worldwide missions.

My pastor, Dr. Felton Griffin, was a fiery preacher from Texas who wore a bolo tie and cowboy boots. He had a voice that could raise the roof and antics from the pulpit that captivated the attention of his congregants. He was known across Alaska for his famous sermon, which he preached annually called "Hell and High Water." There were hundreds of people flocking to the church to hear the sermon and watch this preacher acting like Noah, dramatically running across the stage to tell the story of the great flood. The church printed tickets to determine how many nights Brother Griff would preach that sermon.

My parents sang in the choir, rehearsed every Thursday night, and sang every Sunday morning. The music minister was Roger Laube, a local banker who loved church music. Every year, the church would produce an Easter cantata and a musical Christmas program that was second to none in its day. The acquisition of English handbells led to the organization of the first handbell choir in Alaska. In this setting, I developed a deep love for Christian music.

Fall Revivals were a regular part of the annual calendar at First Baptist Church. Brother Griff, as church members affectionately called him, would invite well-known Baptist evangelists to preach for a week of services. One of his favorite evangelists was Dr. Johnny Bisagno. I will never forget the evening I sat in the service beside my father and heard Dr. Bisagno say nobody can decide for you. Not your family, not your church, not your best friend. He stated you must own your sins and personally confess those sins to receive salvation. I was immediately convicted of my sin and asked my dad what to do. He led me to the front of the church during the invitation and explained how to pray, confess my sins, and receive salvation and pardon for my sins. My pastor, Felton Griffin, baptized me and I began my faith journey in this wonderful church in downtown Anchorage.

First Baptist Church, Anchorage was the mother church to many of the churches in the state and was very instrumental in the formation of the Alaska Baptist Convention. Thank God for a gospel-centered church that remains faithful in proclaiming the message of salvation.



March 2025 Alaska Baptist Foundation article- Estate Planning- Building with a Foundational Approach:

In this first article of 2025, we focus on the essentials of estate planning. Where best can we start than with the ultimate source of truth: The Holy Bible/Word of God.

Scripture reminds us of the importance of building on a solid foundation (stone) --Jesus Christ. Providing certainty that what is built on that stone (individuals) has stability (love and faith), purpose (hope) and longevity (everlasting life). Scripture refers to us as the household of God a holy dwelling place. A good estate plan shares similar characteristics. Let's evaluate the central components to consider in estate planning using the analogy of building a house.

Start With a Solid Foundation:

Central to this concept is identifying and clarifying two critical issues which are interrelated:

1. What objectives do I wish to accomplish

2. What values do I specifically wish to express to those around me, especially family and friends.

In many ways these describe the essence of the individual and therefore figure prominently in the estate plan of one's life and the resources they have accumulated. For example, if one values education, an objective of an estate plan may involve providing learning opportunities to beneficiaries and/or offering scholarships to the broader community. If an individual holds a value of being philanthropic in providing for spiritual and physical needs, then their estate would involve charitable giving directly or be designed in a way to guide beneficiaries to engage in charitable endeavors.

Beginning the Building Process:

After the foundation has been established, we start planning what kind of house we can build.

In the estate planning process this consists of three items:

1. Conduct an Inventory of One's Belongings- This refers to what type of assets or property make-up the estate, things like real estate, motor vehicles, antiques and collectibles, bank investment accounts, insurance etc.

2. Consider Who You Want to Be Beneficiaries- Who or what will benefit (inherit) the assets of one's estate. Being familiar with the specific state laws of inheritance is recommended. Knowing how an estate is disposed of statutorily, in the absence of a Will or Trust, is important.

3. Consider how Your Estate is Managed - These deal with issues such as how best to carry out the transposition of estate assets. For example, whether to use trust or beneficiary designations to transfer various property, setting up power of attorneys to deal with healthcare or financial issues, evaluating the proper use of insurances etc. This area of estate planning is often the most complex, leading to the final portion of our estate planning building analogy.

Use Care and Diligence in the Building Process:

Just as individuals seek the expertise of a carpenter for the house, mechanic for the car, or healthcare professional for personal medical needs. Individuals are encouraged to seek insight and assistance from specialists in estate matters, especially in the areas of finance and law. Finally, it is important to regularly monitor one's estate plan to ensure that all the elements from the foundation to the finished structure are properly aligned.

As a matter of degree this duty of care is to extend to all property the Lord has entrusted to our management/stewardship.

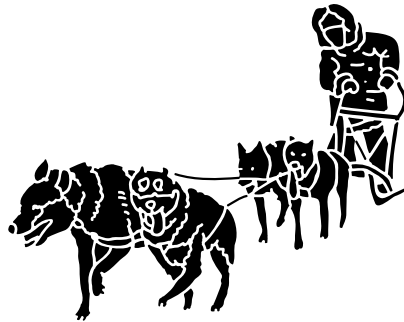
